

By bringing NYP to the world, NYPi has contributed much to complement NYP's internationalisation efforts and its vision to become a premier polytechnic of global distinction.

The strong ties NYPi has fostered with foreign institutions have created more opportunities for NYP's staff and students to gain overseas exposure.

It has established four Student Project and Learning centres in China. Following the setup of a centre in the Beijing Information Technology College in November 2006, another three NYP student centres located within Suzhou Industrial Park Institute of Vocational Technology, Guangzhou Panyu Polytechnic and Chengdu Polytechnic were subsequently established. Since 2007, more than 2,200 students have undergone attachments in these centres.

NYP to Host Three New Degree Programmes

There are now more options available to polytechnic graduates who wish to pursue further education in university. In October 2012, NYP signed two Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) to host undergraduate degree programmes on its campus.

The first MOU, between NYP, Singapore Institute of Technology (SIT) and Trinity College Dublin on 29 October 2012, launched Singapore's first full-time Bachelor of Science with Honours degree programmes in Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy. Polytechnic graduates who qualify will be given advanced standing and graduate with honours after one year. The signing of the MOU was witnessed by Minister for Health, Mr Gan Kim Yong.

NYP also inked a second MOU with SIT and Newcastle University to host Singapore's first undergraduate degree programme in Electrical Power Engineering. The signing ceremony was witnessed by Minister in the Prime Minister's Office and Second Minister for Home Affairs and Trade and Industry, Mr S Iswaran on 30 October 2012.

NYP Forges New Strategic Partnerships

Students can now look forward to more learning opportunities, thanks to the signing of four agreements between NYP and industry partners over the past few months.

On 20 October 2012, NYP and SCAPE Co. Ltd signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). This collaboration involves the sharing of retail management expertise and knowledge to enhance the School of Business Management's curriculum as well as creating opportunities for NYP students and alumni to enjoy favourable leasing terms at *SCAPE Underground.

The Polytechnic also signed a MOU with the Ministry of Defence (MINDEF) on 1 November 2012, leveraging NYP's innovations and solution development capabilities to address MINDEF's operational needs. The collaboration also offers more entrepreneurial and R&D opportunities for students through involvement in actual industry projects.

A MOU was also inked between NYP and Singapore Land Authority (SLA) on 7 November 2012 to collaborate on geospatial education, training, as well as R&D. SLA will also award a SLA Geospatial Scholarship annually from 2013 to 2015 to an outstanding final year student in the Geospatial and Mobile Innovation specialisation track under the School of Information Technology's Diploma in Information Technology programme.

NYP also signed a MOU with the Institution of Engineers Singapore to nurture technopreneurship on 4 December 2012. The collaboration involves developing entrepreneurship mentor networks, start-up support programmes, entrepreneurship eco-system networking and technology commercialisation programmes. It will leverage NYP's capabilities in technology innovation and product development as well as its incubation facilities.

SIRS Customises Courses to Hone Youth Entrepreneurial Skills

Youth entrepreneurs residing at *SCAPE Underground can now take up courses to help sharpen their retail and entrepreneurial skills for a successful and sustained career in business.

Under the Retail Entrepreneurship Programme, all tenants of the latest retail space in the youth hub at Orchard Road can participate in a holistic suite of retail and entrepreneurship training courses.

The Singapore Institute of Retail Studies (SIRS) customised these courses covering visual merchandising, selling and customer service skills, and it will deliver on-site training and personalised on-the-job coaching for participants.

Healthcare PCP Students to Benefit from Enhanced Incentives

Amid-career professional looking to become a nurse or an allied health professional will enjoy more incentives starting April 2013. These include enhanced monthly allowance rates, from between 50% to 70% higher than current rates, and fully sponsored course fees

Minister of State for Health, Dr Amy Khor announced these changes at the Healthcare Learning Journey event held at NYP on 6 October 2012.

These changes will benefit adult learners in four Professional Conversion Programmes (PCP) – in Nursing, Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy and Diagnostic Radiography – currently conducted by NYP's School of Health Sciences.

Another enhanced measure allows short-listed candidates to undergo attachments at healthcare institutions. This will give them a first-hand appreciation of the work of nurses and allied professionals.



NYP Holds Food Safety Workshop for Asia-Pacific's Experts The International Life Sciences Institute Southeast Asia Region, United Nations Food and Agriculture Organisation and NYP jointly organised a comprehensive lab-based food safety training workshop from 19 to 23 November 2012.

Aimed at enhancing food safety monitoring in the Asia-Pacific

region, the inaugural workshop, held in NYP, was attended by a select group of 25 leading scientists from 10 Asian countries. Guided by renowned food safety experts, participants discussed the latest techniques for the analysis of the pathogenic Vibrio parahaemolyticus bacteria in bivalve shellfish. The bacteria are a major cause of foodborne diseases in this region.

PlayStation®First Status Awarded to SIDM Specialist Diploma

The Specialist Diploma in Games Development offered by NYP's School of Interactive & Digital Media (SIDM) has been awarded PlayStation®First status, an Academic Partnership Programme run by Sony Computer Entertainment Asia and World Wide Studios.

The PlayStation®First status is awarded to a select group of partners providing best practices in PlayStation® production values, research applications and game development skills.

Launched in 2006, the Specialist Diploma in Games Development provides an invaluable opportunity for employees of local companies and start-ups with a keen interest to be trained in game console development on the PlayStation® platform and the latest in motion-controlled based gaming. The next intake, the sixth run, will begin in August 2013.

New Part-Time SBM Programmes for Lifelong Learners

YP's School of Business Management launched two new part-time diplomas in Business Practice, under the Ministry of Education's new Continuing Education and Training framework, in October 2012.

These programmes will provide broad-based business education for students, with specific skills training in the areas of Accounting and Supply Chain Management.

Both programmes can be completed in two and a half years.

Participants will receive a modular certificate after successfully completing each semester and will be conferred a Diploma in Business Practice (Accounting) or Diploma in Business Practice (Supply Chain Management) after obtaining five designated modular certificates.

SEG Collaborates with CSIT to Enhance Infocomm Security

Monitoring suspicious online activities as a precautionary measure is fast becoming an important aspect of infocomm security. One way to do this is to capture screen display images which can now constitute as proof of a security infringement or lapse.

NYP's School of Engineering (SEG) has collaborated with the Centre for Strategic Infocomm Technologies (CSIT) to develop an imaging streaming system, which allows screen display images to be streamed discreetly

into remote portable storage devices for further off-line review and analysis.

This innovative system replaces the existing approach of using hardware plugged into a target's PC. The system can be installed easily onto the PC and minimises the possibility of alerting potential suspects. It also has a standalone firmware to manage the activation and streaming of PC images into common secondary storage devices such as micro SD memory cards and thumb drives.

Seniors at the Adventist Home for the Elders now have more opportunities to be plugged into the fast-paced world of IT, thanks to two new Android game apps specially developed by the People Sector Infocomm Resource Centre (PSIRC) in NYP.

The Home approached PSIRC with the idea to create games for its residents as a means to bridge the IT gap with the tech-savvy young. The games encourage active ageing and keep seniors mentally alert. For instance, the 'Can See, Can Hear' app uses graphical tiles and audio devices to challenge the memory of players while the 'Snake & Ladder Plus' app uses pictorial questions to help users recall key moments in Singapore's history.

REGIONAL RED HAT CHALLENGE

The competition attracted more than 1,500 participants from tertiary education institutions in the region including several universities.
